

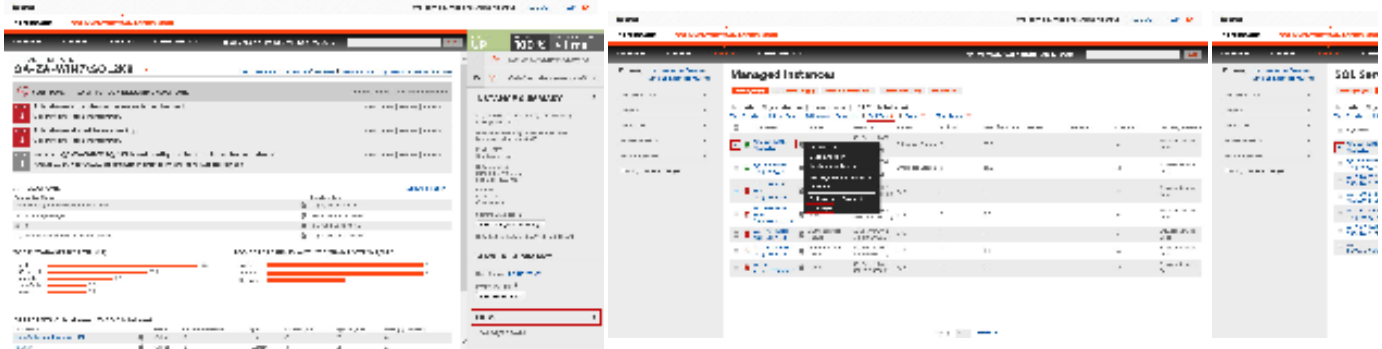
Manage tags for a single instance

SQL Inventory Manager allows you to manage tags for a specific instance. When you access this option you can choose which tags you want to add or delete for the respective instance.

If you want to edit tags for a single instance, use one of the following options in SQL Inventory Manager:

- **Overview** - In the Instances section, click an instance name. In the Instance Details view, click the pencil icon on the Tags section of the right sidebar.
- **Instances > Managed** view - Select your instance, and then click **Edit Tags** on the action items bar *OR* click the gear icon next to the instance, and then select **Edit Tags**.
- **Instances > SQL Licensing** view - Select your instance, and then click **Edit Tags** on the action items bar *OR* click the gear icon next to the instance, and then select **Edit Tags**.

Below you can see the sections where you can access the option for managing tags for a single instance:



SQL Inventory Manager opens a window for managing the instance tags. On this window you can:

- Type the name of a new tag, and then click **ADD**. SQL Inventory Manager adds the new tag to the list. You can add several tags at once by separating each name with a semicolon (;).
- Check or uncheck those tags you want to add or remove for this instance. Previously-added and newly-added tags are checked by default.

When you finish making your edits, click **APPLY**.
